

Pastor's Message

Moving Forward



There is no going back. I'm not trying to be dramatic. I'm just being honest. Time moves in one direction – forward. We can *look* back. We can *learn* from the past, but time only moves forward in our world.

Moving forward is what we need to do as well.

The Covid-19 crisis is not going away anytime soon. I wish it was. However, even when the most intense time passes (who knows when that will be) it feels like things will be different for a while. I'm not saying anything you don't already know. Something is different now. Something is fundamentally new here.

That requires that we think and act in new ways as well. That includes how we worship and how we grow as a Community of Faith. This means not just the things we've already done to adapt so far (which I feel we all have done quite well together), but moving forward also means how we will do things in the

future beyond what we've already done so far. This clearly has challenges, but it presents opportunities as well. It may be hard to see the upside in all of this, but it exists. "Those who have walked in darkness have seen a great light." Versions of this statement are in Isaiah and Matthew.

We're in a kind of darkness right now. You may even feel like you're in the middle of a storm, or like you drew the "short straw." I can feel it. Maybe you can too. Yet there is an implication in this scripture, that there is light that we might not recognize that has already begun to shine. The next verse says, "Those who lived in deep darkness, on them light has shined."

The light is already shining. It may be hard to see. It may be concealed for one reason or another, but it's there as surely as the sun is still there when we experience the night. We're going to find that light and we're going to follow it.

That's how we'll move forward.

As part of our process of moving forward, in late July we established the *Moving Forward Team*. The goal of the *Moving Forward Team* is to help us all explore what is possible, what is safe and what is best to do as a Community of Faith in the future. Looking at what a return to the building might look like and in what timeframe will certainly be an important part of what the team does.

That is incredibly complex and doing it right is profoundly important. It is important for your safety and it is important for the safety of the greater community. We are leaders in this community. We are our brothers and sisters keepers. We bear that responsibility for you and others. We take that very seriously. However, there is much more to it than that. Like considering what other ways we can grow together and be connected, even if it doesn't involve the hugs and handshakes and physical face-to-face time we might long for. Like considering questions such as, "What is possible?" and "Where is the light directing us?" - even if it isn't where we expect it to lead.

This team will work with staff, various church teams, Deacons, Council and me as we work towards what we will do in the future. You will get an opportunity to have a voice in this as well.

I don't know what the answers are. I do know the light will guide us, and that we have many lights in this community of faith. Thank you for being on this journey with us.

Community Kitchen




