





GOD Is Still Speaking...

Many years ago Eli Prosser made a contribution of \$15,000 to the First Congregational Church of Bloomfield to provide emergency funding for the elderly indigent in Bloomfield. Over the years that fund has grown significantly to several hundred thousand dollars. Each year the Mission Team works closely with the Bloomfield Social Services so that the interest generated by the fund can be used to help Bloomfield seniors with financial emergencies. Since July 1st, the Prosser Fund has given approximately \$19,000.00 to Bloomfield seniors. The fund purchased a lift chair, a bed, and made rent and mortgage payments on behalf of local residents dealing with emergency medical bills and unemployment due to illness and delayed disability determinations by Social Security. Prosser funds helped with the application fee for a hearing aid, and paid past due water and electric bills so that those services could be restored. One grateful gentleman explained in his thank-you note that he returned home from purchasing groceries, having used all his food stamps, to find that the electric company had turned his power off. He asked everyone he knew and no one could help him come up with the money needed to get the electricity turned back on. He said it was going to take a "...miracle..." to save all that food in his fridge. In desperation, he contacted Bloomfield Social Services who contacted the Prosser Fund, and together, we were able to get the money to Eversource in time to save the food. In his note of thanks, this senior called the First Congregational Church of Bloomfield his "...guardian angel...". Upon hearing that the Mission Team had approved several other funding requests, one of the town's social workers responded "...I am sitting at my desk with a few tears rolling down my cheek... I thank you for so much generosity over the years. The approval of these requests will mean so much to the individuals and their families.

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES 10/18/17

Attendees: R. Robinson, S. Goetjen, C. Delgado, J. Casner, E, Ayala *ex officio*, C. Wilson. Meeting was opened with a prayer.

FINANCIAL UPDATE: For the three months ending in September, pledges were behind budget compared to last year. Expenses are below budget which is in line at this time period of the year. The larger amount shown for repairs and maintenance of the church is for the steeple work...The budget to be presented and voted on at the meeting on October 29 is not significantly different from the draft presented at the June annual meeting. The timing of when a new settled pastor is called and will actually start will somewhat alter the expense bottom line...The meeting on October 29 will be held in Fellowship Hall so that everyone can, first, join Faye Smith in celebrating her 100th birthday!

SEARCH UPDATE: Ursula Dang attended the meeting to share the current status of the search process. Twenty-seven profiles have been received with twenty-three reviewed. Six profiles were chosen for interview. One candidate has since accepted another position. Of the remaining five most favorable profiles, four were interviewed via computer, and one was interviewed in person. There will be second interviews scheduled for the stronger candidates. Pastor Tamara Moreland, Regional Conference Minister, met with council to explain the transition period between Pastor Ed's departure and the start date of the new settled pastor. She calls this period an "intentional Interim", lasting up to 6 - 8 months depending on how soon the search team unanimously decides on and secures a candidate to present to our congregation. She has posted notice through the Conference that FCC Bloomfield is looking for someone to fill this transitional position. There will be a small group of council/diaconate members who will interview the interim transition minister. Ron will post an article in the Spire specific to Pastor Ed's departure.

STAFF PERFORMANCE APPRAISALS:

Pastor Ed presented these performance appraisals and leadership assessments for review by the council. At the next council meeting Ron has asked that areas of improvement and future goals be discussed for each staff person after which salary increase allocations will be decided.

MINISTRY TEAM OPENINGS: Brett

Sandman has accepted the leadership position for Stewardship. Thank you Brett!...Several other opportunities for team leadership/membership are still available such as Membership, Fellowship, Child Development Center, Pastoral Relations, Diaconate member. Please consider stepping up to fill one of these positions to insure that our church moves into the future and is prepared to greet a new settled pastor with a strong governance base.

RACE DIALOGUE: A well-attended second hour was held on conversations about race. Pastor Ed plans to meet with person(s) interested in continuing to gather information and promoting ongoing conversations on this topic.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE: Since Pastor Ed has announced that his last day with us will be on December 3, he asked council members where they felt the emphasis for his work should be placed during his last weeks as our interim minister. Suggestions included: 1) Keeping the focus on the hopeful, caring theme he has consistently used while with us. 2) Using the time as an opportunity to affirm and reassure a positive future for our congregation. 3) Emphasis on the search process status and how much time might be needed to find the right person. 4) Moving forward in an intentional manner. 5) Encouraging the congregation to use patience and kindness in helping the new pastor to get settled...On Nov. 8 a workshop will be given at our church on "Building Your Planned Giving Ministry" by Charles Kuchenbrod from 7-8:30 p.m. This is part of a series presented by the Hartford Association of the CT UCC.




