

CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES

10/21/15

Attendees: C. Delgado, C. Dobo, D. Morrill, E. Ayala *ex officio*, S. Goetjen, C. Hart, C. Wilson.

The meeting opened with a prayer from Pastor Ed. *Pastor's Report:* Now that Pastor Ed is our official Interim Minister, he is getting acquainted with the full range of church procedure at FCC Bloomfield. The first staff retreat will be held tomorrow, and he has met with the Pastoral Care and Mission teams to date. He distributed his preaching schedule through 11/22. The focus for worship will be BUILDING A HEALTHY FAITH COMMUNITY. *Financial* Report: As of Sept. 30, Income is ahead of target because some pledges were prepaid for the entire year. Expenses are mostly in line with the budget. The *balance* due for the ramp has been paid.

Personnel/Salary Increases: MSV to approve salary increases for staff retroactive to July 1st from the payroll pool line item of the budget.

Church Constitution Revisions: There will be a second hour discussion held on Nov. 8 to answer any questions about the proposed revisions to the Church Constitution presented at the Oct. 4th congregational meeting. A special meeting will be held on Dec. 6th after the 10 a.m. service to vote on the proposed changes.

Music Program: The special music line item amount in the budget will only cover those expenses through December. An appeal letter will be sent to the congregation to solicit the \$2,100 needed to continue special music from Jan. through June.

Mission Team Proposal: Information is being gathered about the possibility of having the now-vacant parsonage used by a refugee family. Much information needs to be gathered about how such a process would work, what other organizations would be involved, financial considerations, time frame, etc. before deciding to undertake this project.

Council Priorities and Next Steps:

Exploration of adult education component of Faith Formation

Review/update job descriptions

Clarify custodial employment status
Growth of the Church

Gifts to the Church have to be approved by Council. Sally Foster would like to give her painting "Meadow of Diversity", created in conjunction with one of the summer sermons, to the Deacons. MSV to accept the painting.

After a benediction, the meeting was adjourned at 8:45 p.m. Next meeting will be Nov. 18 at 7 p.m.


